

Market Share Obligation Report - Household Obligation

Based on WEEE Collection Targets Published by BIS on 25 March 2014

If you are a B2C Producer, placing over 5 tonnes of EEE onto the UK Market annually, you are responsible for financing the recycling and recovery a proportion of the EEE you place onto the market. This is based on a "Market Share Principle".

You may find it useful to know how this is determined. In order to calculate this, the following formula is used:

$$(A \div B) \times C$$

Where:

A = the total amount of EEE in tonnes within the relevant category you placed on the UK Market in 2013

B = the total amount of EEE in tonnes within the relevant category placed on the UK Market in the UK in 2013

C = the total amount of WEEE in tonnes within the relevant category that has been determined by the Secretary of State to be the Collection Target for 2014

You can use the table below to help you determine your 2014 B2C WEEE obligation in each category.
